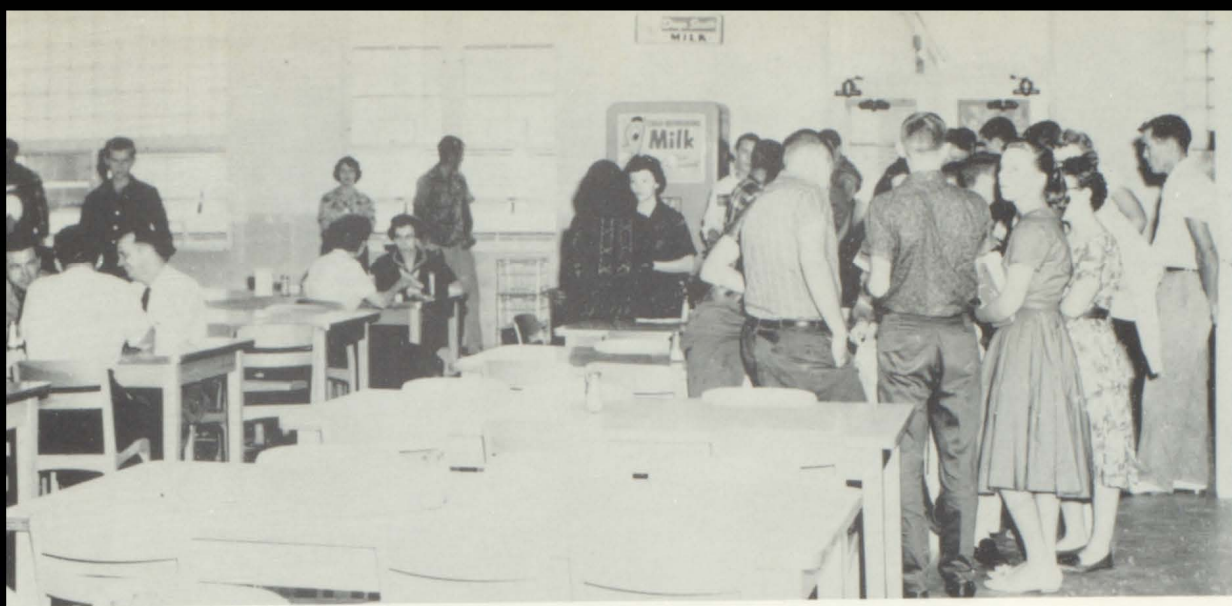


At lunch time around C.H.S. one can always find a group of girls sitting around enjoying the shade of the trees and our pretty campus.

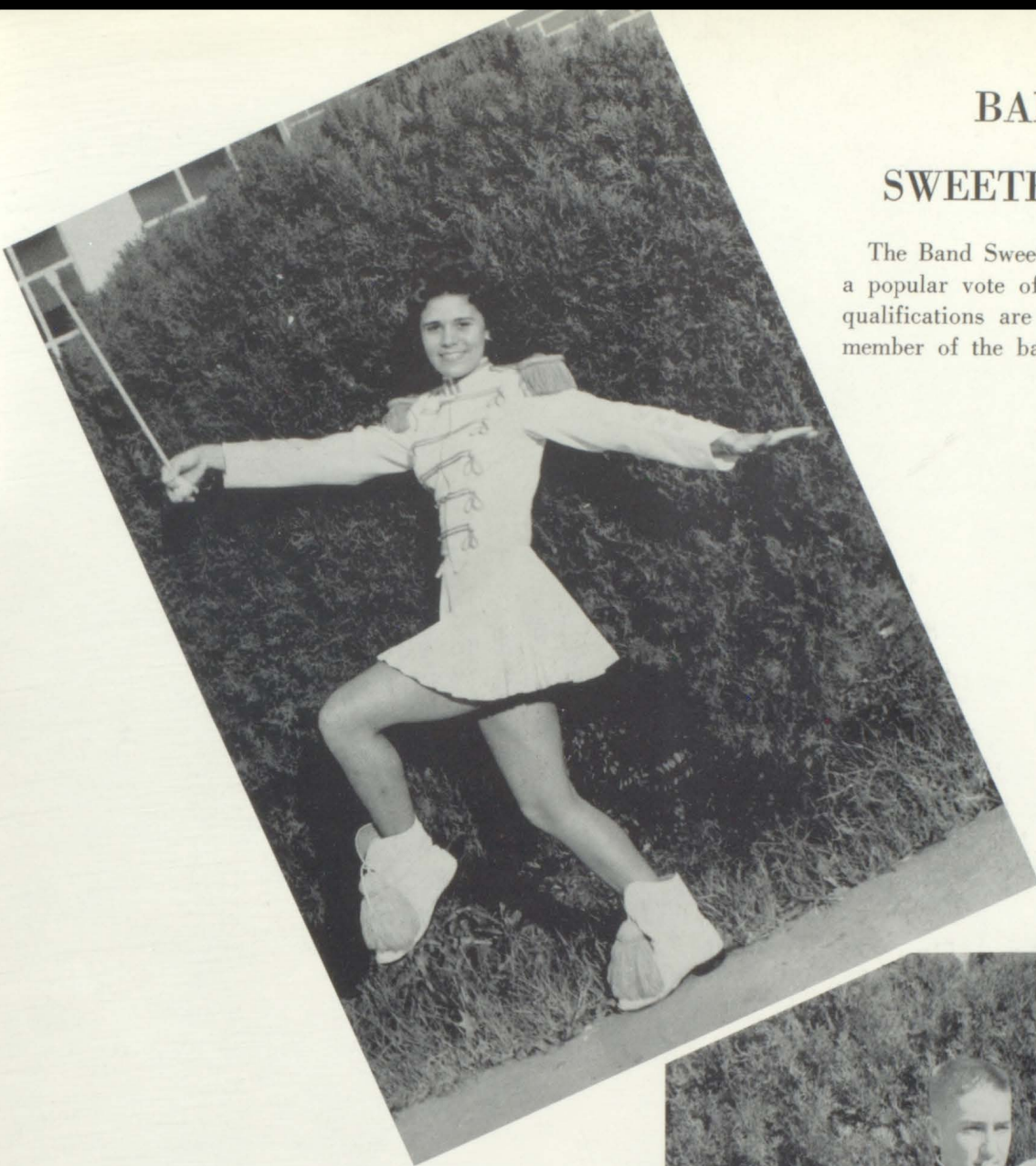

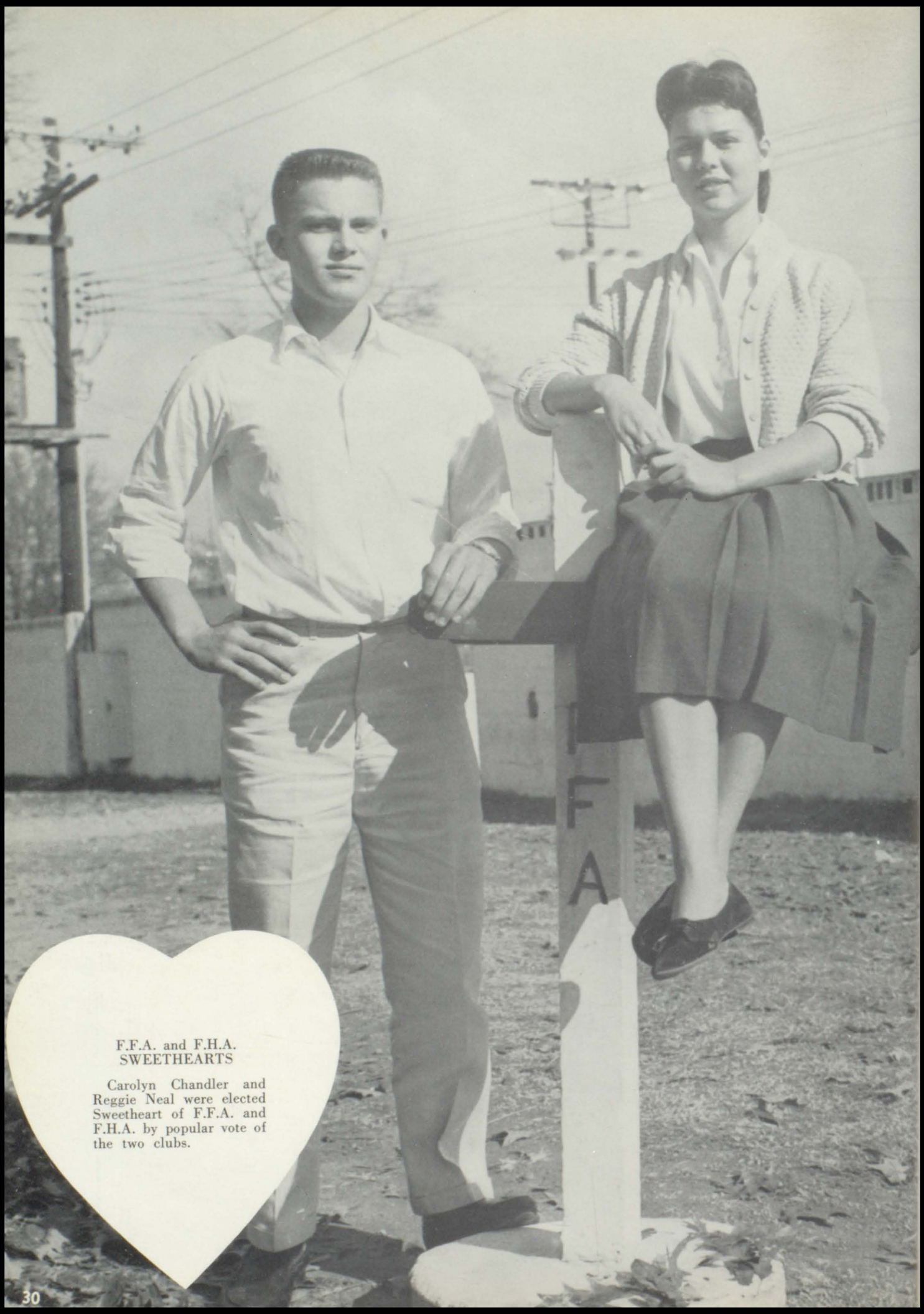

MARY RUTH PACK and LARRY HAZELRIGG were elected by popular vote of the D.O. students.

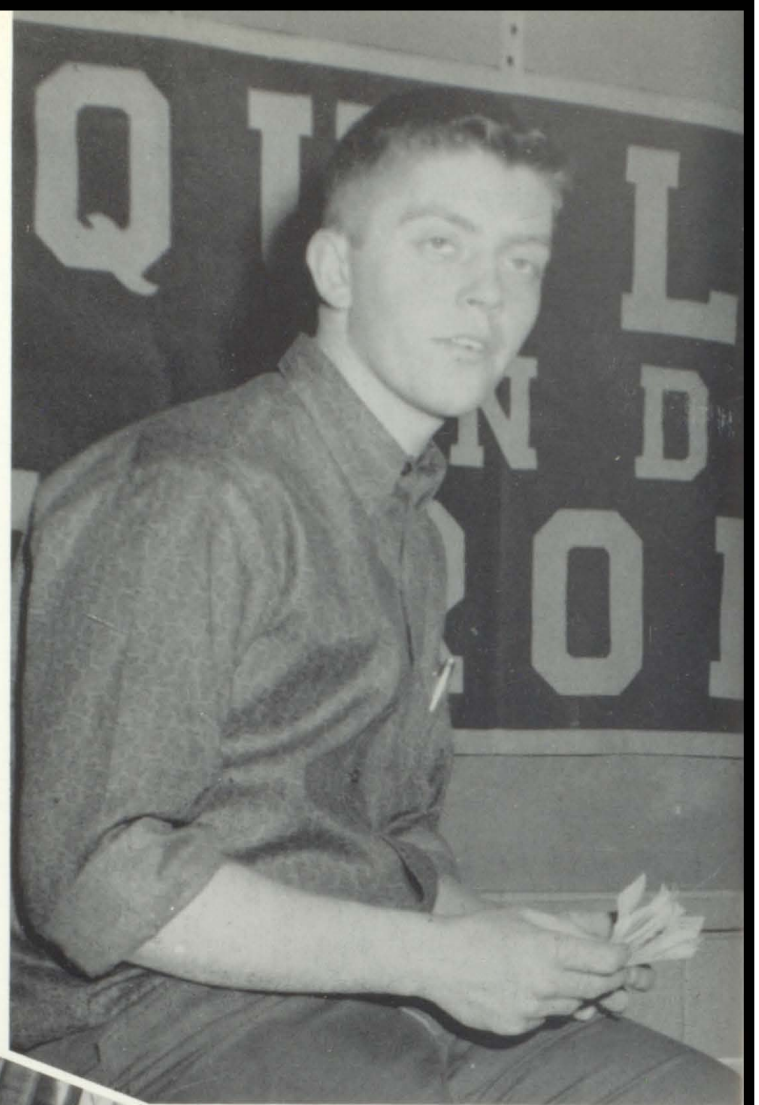

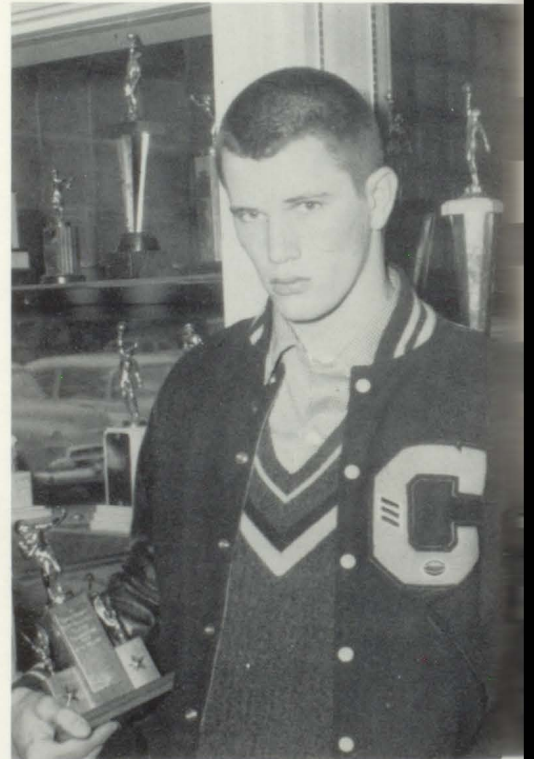

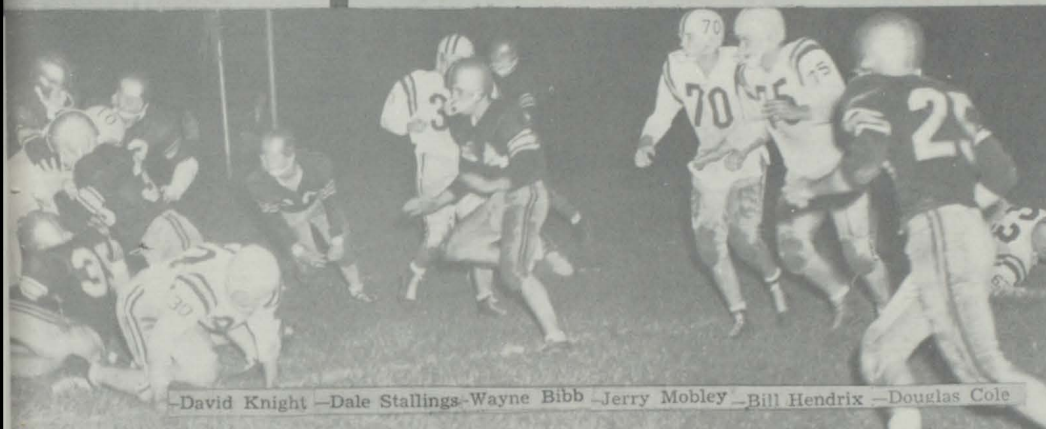
# Cullman 'Cats beat Walker 19-12

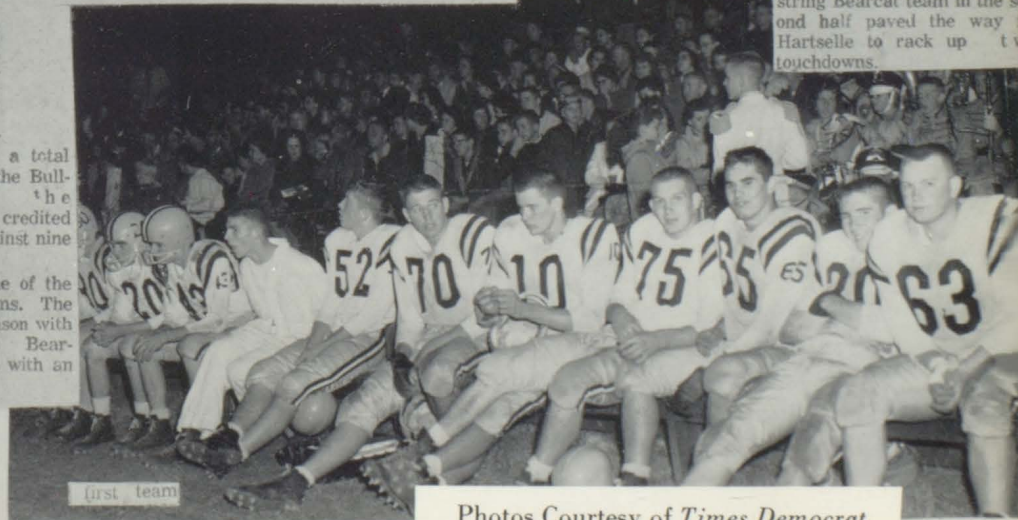
Every Bearcat player, only one was passed out, played during the game with some switching positions they had never

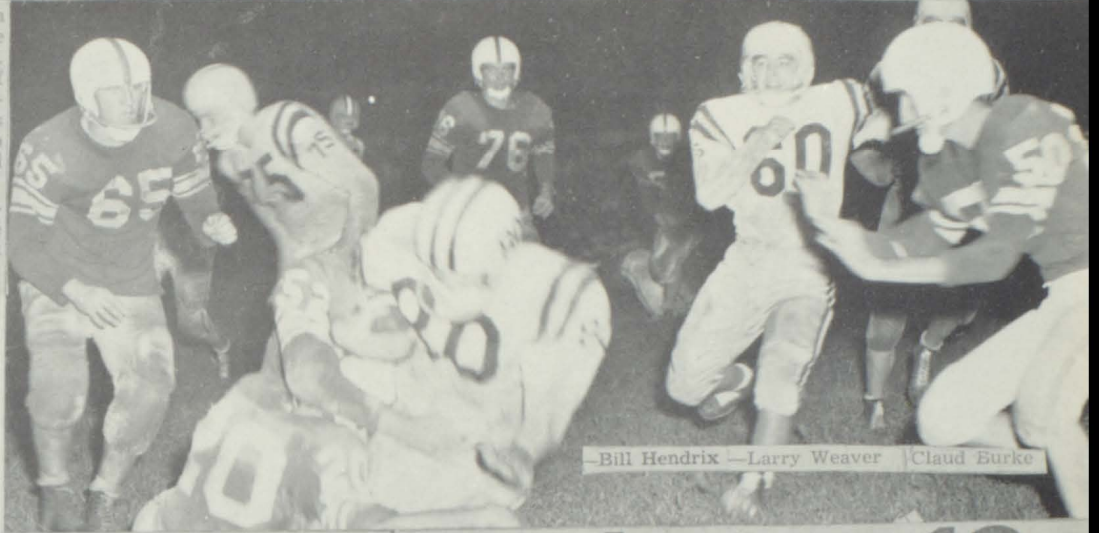

Cullman was penalized a total of 130 yards during the game to 85 yards against Moulton.



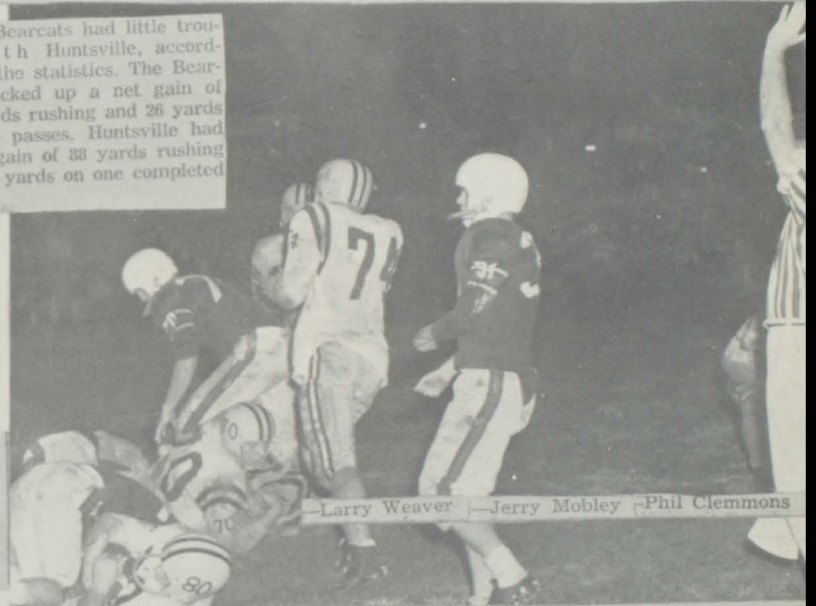

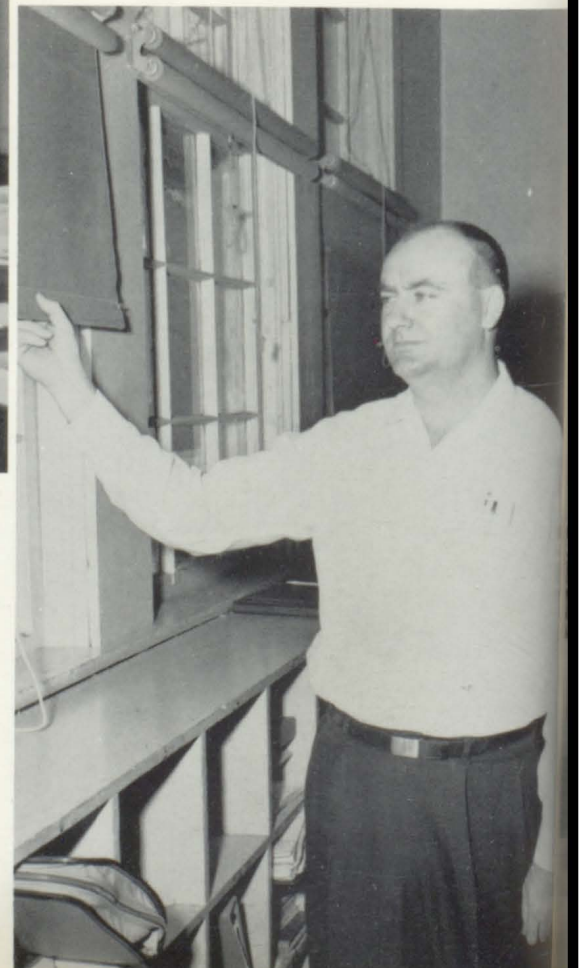

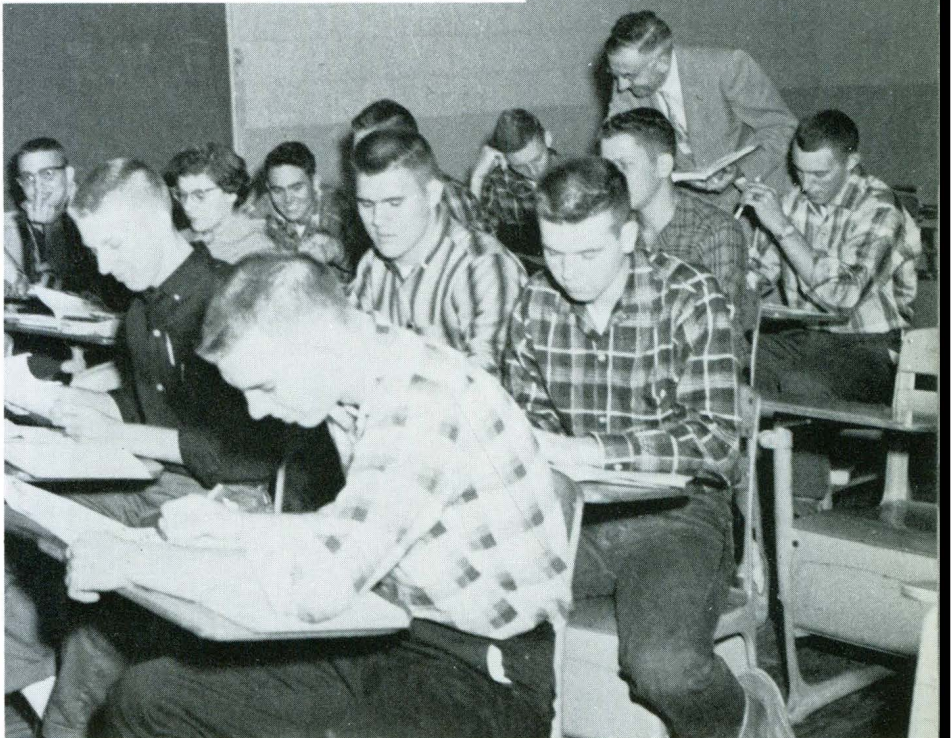

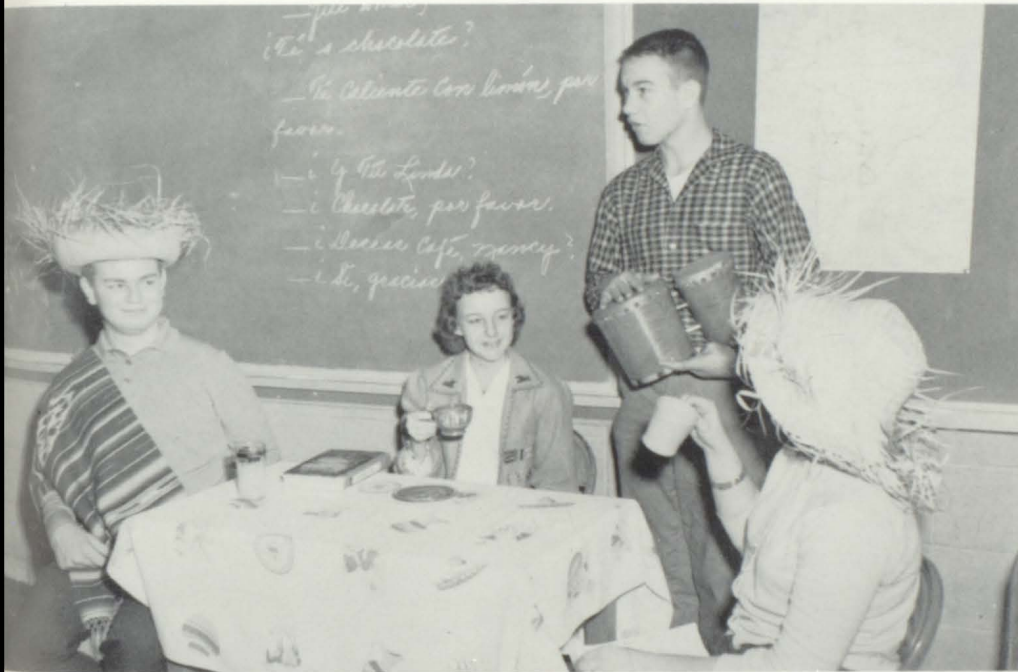

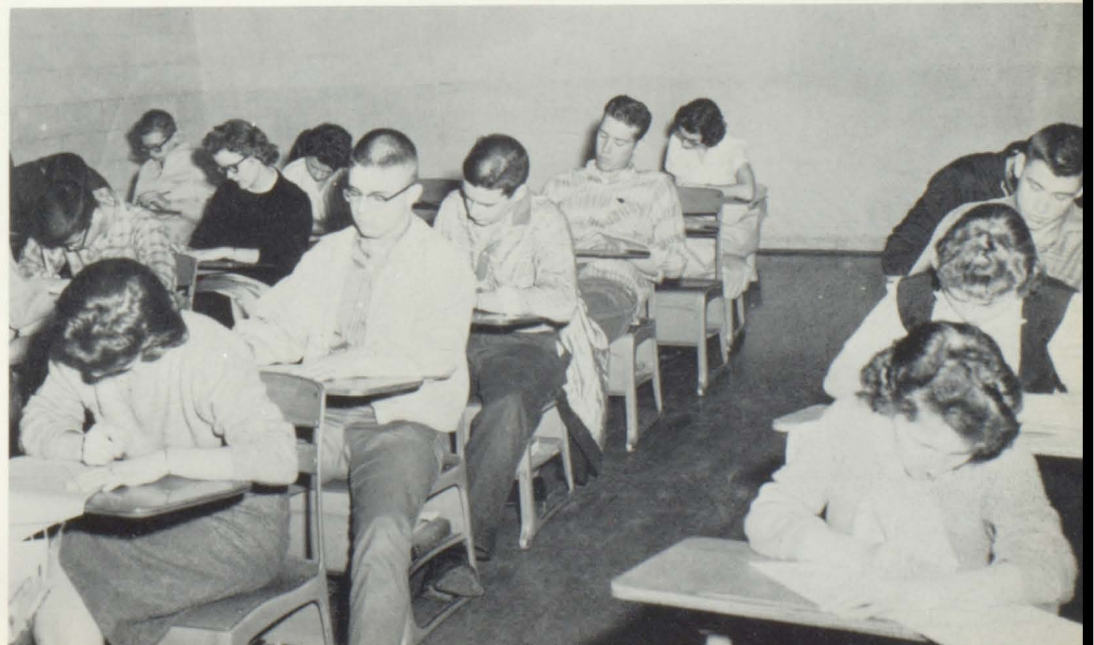

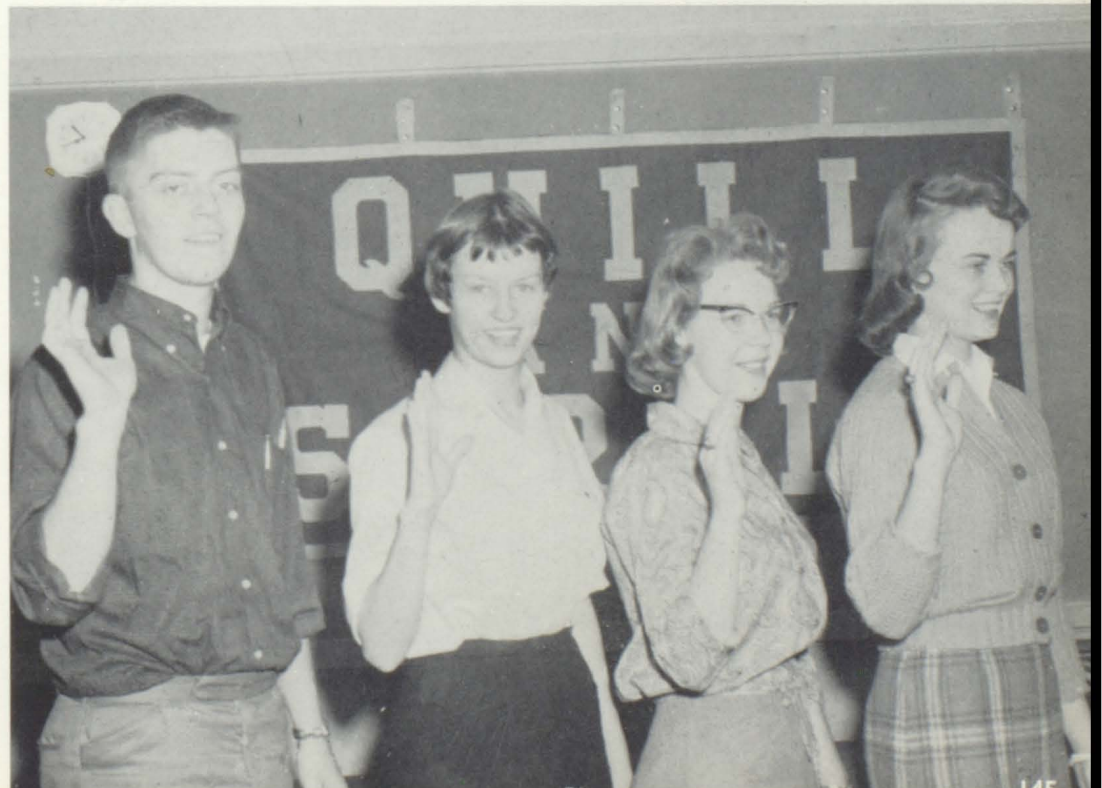

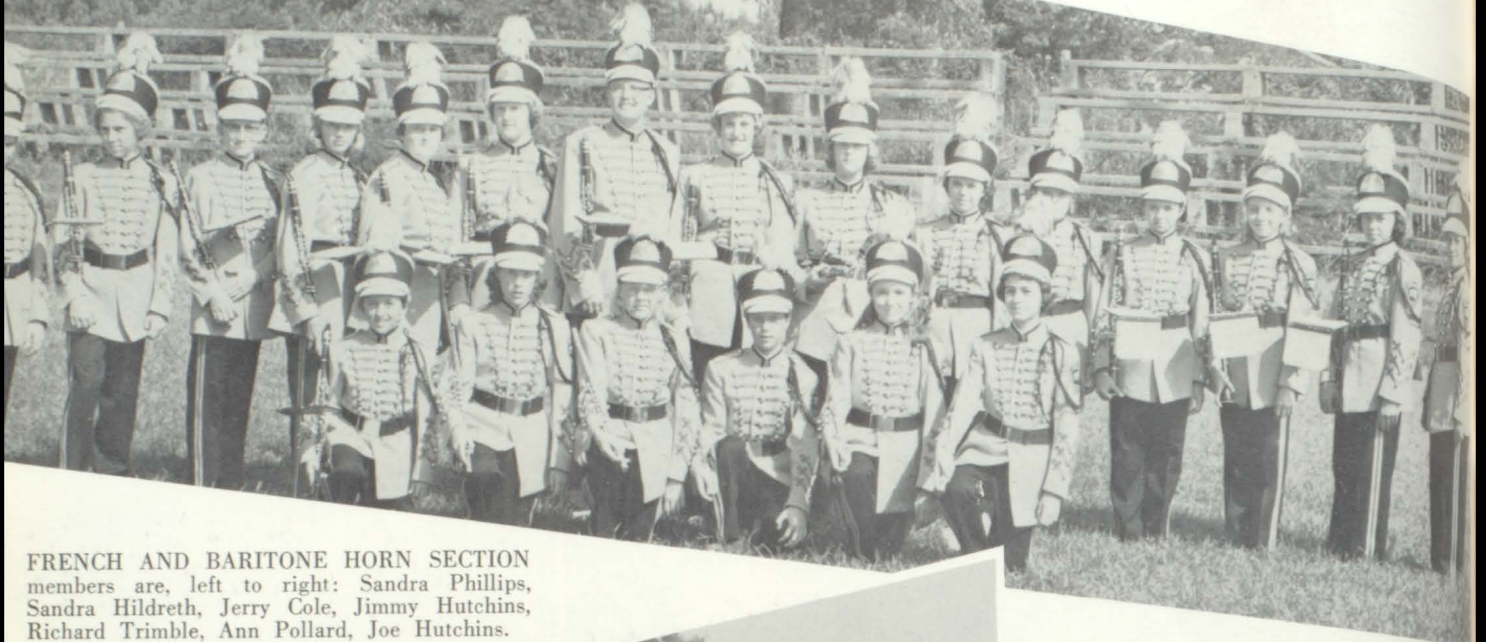

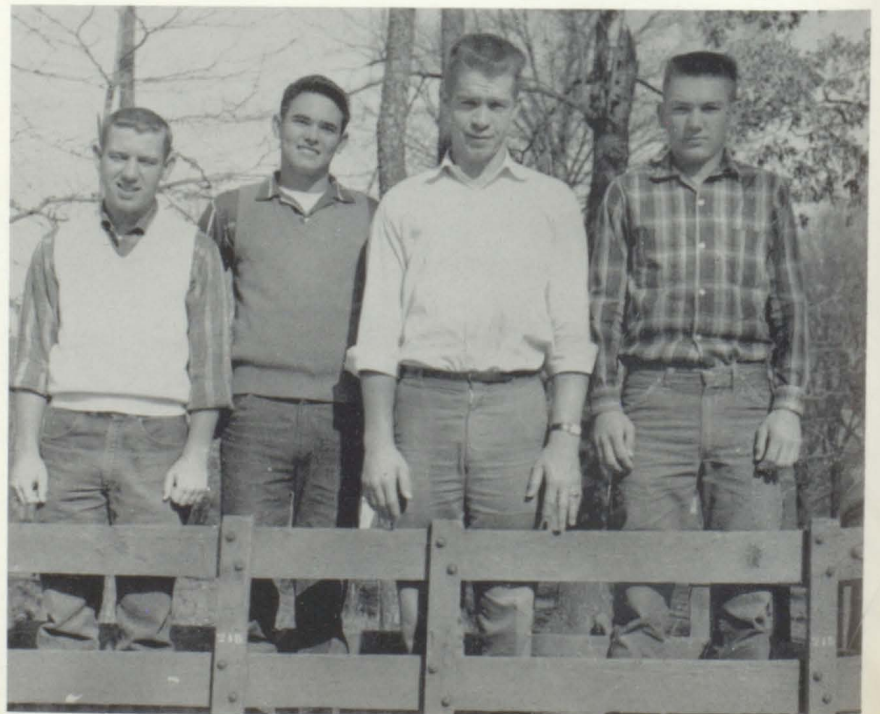
