## A Natural Major

Saint Bernard is constantly redefining itself.

One hundred and one years ago (January 1892) a monastery was founded here by German Benedictine monks. Nine months after that a school was opened. For the most part of the next century, Saint Bernard operated either a high school, a college, or a preparatory school. Buildings have been built and razed. Programs, administrators, and faculty have come and gone. The commitment to Catholic education endures.

The major change this year has been the addition of a music program. The school now has classes in music appreciation and music science. The music ensemble meets as a class and performs publicly. This new program is very promising.

One of the most difficult changes for S.B.P. was the increase in enrollment. There was a 30 percent growth from last year's enrollment. The classes got larger. The lunchroom became choked. The vans became cramped on trips. The positive consequence of all this was the pride felt that the school was growing.

Considering these changes, an idea for the yearbook theme came about. The theme should be about music. It should also be specifically about Saint Bernard.

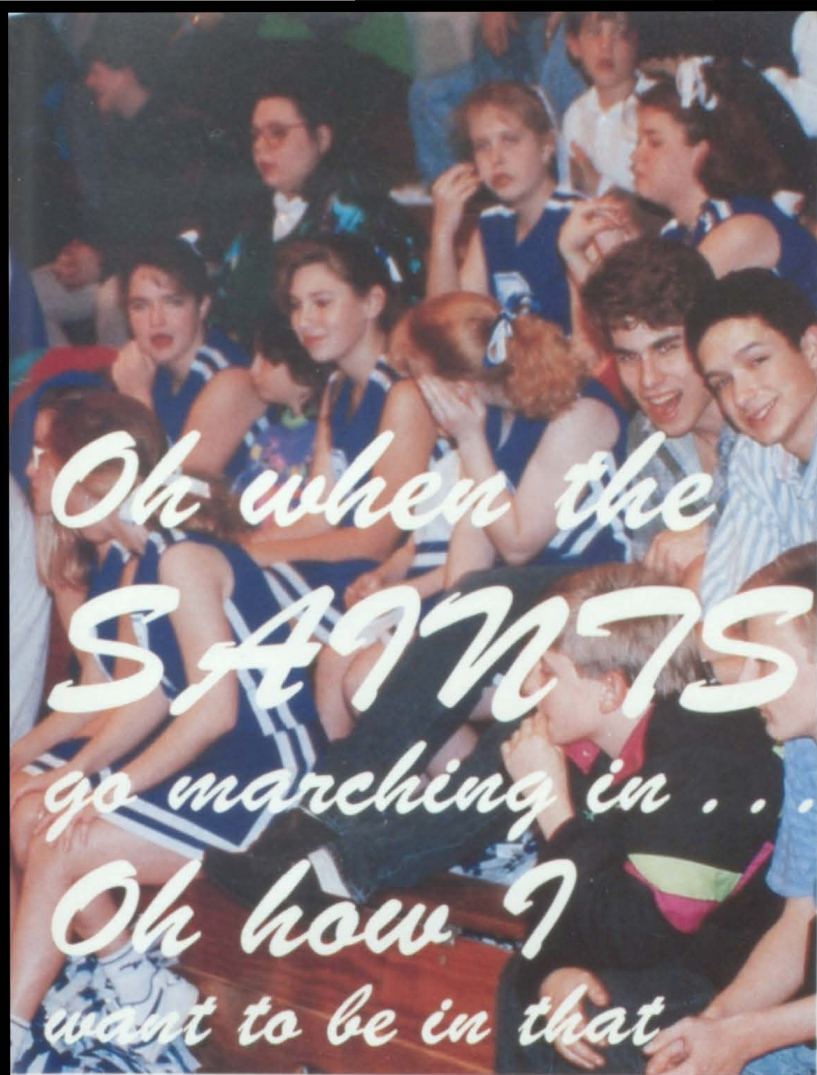
The most important element of success is teamwork. Staff, parents, faculty, and students all combine their efforts for a fun and productive weekend.
